Radio and Television Stations

Under federal licensing laws all radio and TV stations must allow emergency broadcasts.

Global Connect

The communities of Long Beach Township, Beach Haven Borough, Ship Bottom Borough, Harvey Cedars and Barnegat Light all jointly participate in an emergency notification system called Global Connect. This system notifies the public of any emergency or health hazard that may occur in our area. Verizon residential phone customers are automatically a part of the database. Non-Verizon customers can become a part of the database by completing a form from the Long Beach Island Health Department or registering on longbeachtownship.com. This is a FREE service and landline and/or mobile phones can be registered.

Nixle

This system utilizes mobile phone texting to keep our community advised of both emergent and non-emergent local information. This is also a FREE service and you can become a participant by signing up at www.nixle.com.



Standard 9-1-1

Always remember the best way to report a true emergency is to dial 9-1-1. Verizon landline customers are automatically entered into 9-1-1 database and have full capabilities including sending the 9-1-1 center your telephone number and location when dialed. Non-Verizon customers should make sure that their phone carrier forwards their information to Verizon.



AMBER Alert

is a national system used in the event of a child being missing endangered such as a child abduction. AMBER alerts interrupt regular programming and are broadcast through radio and television and on highway signboards.

Similar to an AMBER alert is a Silver alert. This is an alert for Alzheimer's patients or adults with cognitive disorders who are believed to be lost and endangered. Silver alerts are also broadcast through radio, television and highway signboards.
