Mayor Larson asked if anyone had anything for caucus. Mayor asked Frank what was going on with the Firehouse and the garage. Frank said they said it would be for this Planning Board meeting. Gail said she will call Vince Roth tomorrow. There is no Planning Board scheduled for this month. Gail said she had something and presented Dottie and the Mayor with 20 year certificates from the League of Municipalities. Mayor Larson also mentioned Terry Brady has been our attorney for 20 years as well. They are now inducted into the Elected Officials Hall of Fame. Everyone applauded. George and Michael have both been inducted several years ago. Vince came in and Gail asked him if he had any update on the Fire Co. He said he was hoping for this month but according to the lawyer it will be next month. Frank said that he and Ed Wellington went up to Train the Trainer and got that taken care of. They are going to be doing more work on the other bridges. The 2 bridges closest to the island. They are going to widen them. They are putting a walkway on the one side and bike paths on either side. Narrow the lanes down a little bit. It will take a couple of years for this project. At times they will shut half the bridge down. All the traffic will be going east and west on the same side. The main bridge was not discussed. The completion date is 20/20 for the whole project. The west bridge has not been put out to contract. They are also spending a lot of money into refurbishing the land south of where the shack was. Making a park out of that. Bicycle, walking trails. It looks like they are putting 10 million dollars into that. Dottie asked if that was wet lands. Frank said no. Mayor asked when are they going to put the pumps in Ship Bottom. Kat said she knows Mayor Hulsenback is on that intensely. Dottie said we need that more than the park. We couldn't get off in an emergency. Kat said Ship Bottom has Hummers now. Mayor said the Township has a couple of them. Kat said they were giving them away for free. (To police departments) Kat said nothing is free Kirk! Mayor questioned how the Fire Co. got their deuce and a half. It all came through the Forest Fire Service said Vince Roth. They got slapped on the hand because they did not paint theirs yet. They don't want it looking like a National Guard truck in an emergency. They don't want them confused with each other. Mayor said he wanted one to use as a plow. Our trucks are too small.

WATER/SEWER: Michael Spark was absent.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Frank Mikuletzky asked to make the Court Report a part of the minutes. We got \$266.00 in. It was a slow month. \$1537.00 total was taken in. Make sure you are keeping your car doors locked. There has been a little bit of activity. It was in High Bar. Report suspicious stuff to the township. You can call the 494-3322 number. DOCKS AND HARBORS: Ed Wellington said he did not have much. There are no boats in the water. We have 4 slips available. The guys have been cleaning up the floating docks.

BEACHES AND PARKS: Dottie Reynolds said things have been quiet on the beaches. We have been selling beach badges and are \$1093 ahead of last year.

PUBLIC WORKS: Scott Sharpless asked that the public works report and the water sewer reports be made a part of the minutes. Mayor asked when the for anything to settle with the freezing and thawing we have been having. It is fixed.

FINANCE: George Warr said we are about 1/3 of what we put out in bills. We kept 60% of that money here in Barnegat Light. George asked Kat to comment on the note. 1.03% was the interest rate in 2014 and for 2015 it is .068%. That is in part to Paula. She went out to many banks, other towns. Terry Brady said Paula did an outstanding job. Our debt is getting smaller and smaller every year. It is not worth it for many of the banks to bid on it. Paula received a round of applause.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION:

On a motion by Warr, seconded by Mikuletzky and carried by all the public session was opened. Tim Brindley said he just got a loan from Bank of America. He got a fake call from the IRS. Frank told him to report it to the Police. He had called Comcast. The IRS does not call they just sent letters. Frank does not talk to solicitation people. John Tennyson wanted to say the Emergency Management Brochure was very good. He said they put it up on their Web Site and thought we should do the same. Connie Higgins had two things to say. Thanks to the guys who worked on the water leak. She also thanked the ambulance squad and they were terrific. Kat said she had one thing to add. Kat explained about the Township Shuttle bus and a question that had been asked regarding the county being involved. The Township did reach out to the County. They did not hear back and it is her understanding that the Township does not want the County or the State involved. They are looking in to getting grants for the bus. They are working on finding another way to fund the bus. It is not up to our Council to make any decisions. The Township is handling the whole thing. Kirk said you do not want to charge money on the bus. Being no further comment, on a motion by Warr, seconded by Wellington and carried by all the public session was closed.
