#### REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL June 8, 2016

THE CAUCUS MEETING of the Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Larson at 4:30 pm at the Borough Hall, on East 7<sup>th</sup> Street. He stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act by posting a copy of the notice of this meeting on the bulletin board in the Borough Hall on January 4, 2016 and by mailing a copy of the notice to the Asbury Park Press, new spaper designated by Mayor and Council on January 4, 2016 to receive such notice, and by filing a copy of the notice with the Borough Clerk on January 4, 2016.

ROLL CALL: Spark, Sharpless, Wellington, Reynolds, Mikuletzky, Warr

ALSO PRESENT: Mayor Larson, Tom Kunz, who was sitting in on behalf of Terry Brady, Brenda Kuhn and Nancy Manookian

Discussion: Mayor Larson brought up dumpsters and the need to have them covered. This is already addressed on our code book so we just have to enforce it. The museum and the raccoon problem was the next thing discussed. He said that we were given an estimate for the removal of the raccoons in the amount of \$1926.00. Ed Wellington said that someone told him that they have a family of 5 living in his house. He said it's really getting out of hand. He said Animal Control will only move them a half mile. Tom Kunzasked if the contract said anything about if the raccoons come back. The Acting Clerk said that there was a 1-year warranty against raccoons gaining entrance to the structure. Mayor Larson said that the building is ours so we'll pay the bill. Mayor Larson said that the Sandpaper is doing an article on the bill that was signed by the Governor in January regarding free beach access for active military and their families and veterans. Currently we give free daily badges to active military and their families with the proper ID. We will add Veterans to this beginning with the 2017 Beach Badge Season. The Acting Clerk said that we have been selling badges for this season since November and there have been badges sold to V eterans and many have asked if veterans get free beach access and we have told them not at this time, therefore the best thing to do is to start in the next season. Maria from the Sandpaper said that the law is not mandatory. There was more discussion on this issue. Some of the things that were brought up were, w hat type of proof would the veteran need to produce in order to get a free badge, would this include the veteran's fam ily, the point of view from the auditor and will they get a badge or will we just need to see ID. Councilwom an Reynolds stated they we do give free badges to the Coast Guard but they haven't asked for them yet this year. Mayor Larson said that we should just add a resolution to approve giving them badges during the regular meeting and we should call them to see if they wanted them . The next topic to be discussed was illegal fireworks. Councilm an Mikuletzky stated that we received a letter from Megan Keller of the LBTPD regarding Fireworks Safety. He said that he posted copies of the letter at the post office and at the beach badge booth. Enforcement of the laws regarding fireworks was also discussed. Councilm an Warr said that we should be proactive and we should put a post on our website stating that the fireworks laws will be enforced. Councilm an Warralso suggested putting it on our electronic sign. Mayor Larson brought uppickle-ball. He said that it was very noisy and we really don't have a space to build a pickle-ball court that wouldn't annoy residents. The mayor said we should talk about an ordinance against pickle-ball courts in backyards. They established that size of a pickle-ball court was 20 X 44. Councilm an Spark wanted to talk about what was happening at the bay beach next to the chain that was installed. He said that someone put up a three high-rise boat rack in the last 24 hours and said there was no informational sign there. Councilman Wellington said we finally got the decals for the boats. He also said that there was a letter and a registration form prepared and we were making packets for distribution. He said that in the next couple of days the clerk would distribute them to the beach badge booth, the dock and also have them available at Borough Hall for a "soft implementation" of the tag/registration requirement. He said the dock workers would be going to the areas and informing the non-motorized watercraft owners about the new registration and also attaching the packets to boats. It was mentioned that there is a poison ivy issue and said that public works cut it down.

Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close Caucus Meeting. On a motion by **Sharpless**, seconded by **Reynolds** and carried by all the Caucus Meeting came to an end.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE: Councilman Warr said that the total bills paid for the past month were \$410,231.96.
130,016.62 of that went to pay Regional School tax.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Councilman Mikuletzky said that the Fire Co. is proposing to shut the siren down at night. They are getting quotes for a timer that would stop the siren from sounding from 10:00pm to 6:00am. The traffic lights will be going on next week in Barnegat Light. Fireworks are a concern of our citizens and that we have received a couple of letters. He also said that the Parking Ordinance seems to be working.

BEACHES AND PARKS: Councilwom an Reynolds informed the audience that there were only two days left to get beach badges at the preseason rate. She said that Brenda had some good ideas for the beach badge booth to make it more efficient and useful for next year because it is very crowded in there. She said that the booth is getting a cash register to replace the wooden box! She stated the beach badge revenues are up and we have sold almost \$136,000 so far this year which is \$27,000 more than last year at this time. She said that A shley is looking into bike racks to see if it would be better to purchase them through the state contracts. Councilwoman Reynolds said that we would be installing the access locks at the dog park to get people familiar with the idea that they will need to get a pass in the future. She also said that she would like to get the dog paintings put up again and also children's paintings. They said they could be put up in the infield. Mayor Larson said that we are having problems with the rollup walkways. He said that they should have a discussion about the feasibility of continuing to sell them.

DOCKSAND HARBORS: Councilm an Wellington said that he has already talked about the kayak area. He said as of last week we have taken in \$14,120 at the ramp which is up from last year.

PUBLIC WORKS: Councilm an Sharpless said that he didn't have a Public Work report because Ed is on vacation. He said that the new trash cans, with lids, are on the beach. He said that July 2, 2016 is the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade and on July 4<sup>th</sup> the Jim my Merchant band will be performing.

W ATER/SEW ER: Councilm an Spark said that he didn't get a water sewer report because of Ed's vacation. He said that he had a meeting with the Borough Engineer and Superintendant about water meters. They talked about how to approach this subject because the costs are going to be quite substantial. He said we are also looking for grants to offset the costs. He said another area to consider is how the work will be done. He said that we could hire contractors as temporary Borough employees or subit out to a firm which would a lot more expensive. He said the project is still months out.

Mayor Larson said that the Blessing of the Fleet is on June 19<sup>th</sup>. He said that the Governor turned down his request to attend the event. He said it would be a funnight for everyone.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION: On a motion by Spark, seconded by Sharpless and carried by all the public session was open.

Lois Stiles of Central Avenue asked if you could use a credit/debit card to purchase beach badges. She was told no. Mary Ellen Foley of 10 the Street suggested adding to the price of the badges to net the same amount. She said that the Square is \$10.00 and you would use it with a smart phone. Mickey Spinelle of 40 West 4 the Street asked if the town would consider building one to two pickle-ball courts. He brought his ball and paddle to let the council hear what it sounds like. Mayor Larson said that may be we will send the committee down to Harvey Cedars some day in the summer to watch and listen to some one playing pickle-ball. Councilwoman Reynolds said we would have to see where we could put something like this where it wouldn't disturb the area residents. Joe Hogan of 3rd Street asked if the Coast Guard property could be used for pickle-ball. Mayor Larson asked Mr. Hogan if he would like to have a court next to his house and he said, "No". Ed Ebenbach of West 8 Street said that he was representing the Taxpayers Association and thanked council for mentioning the meeting. He said that they would be presenting the 2016 survey at their meeting that would be held on the 18 house and he said, that there was poison ivy in the front

half and that it should be sprayed. Michelle Wellington from West 12 th Street said that she liked Councilm an Warr's suggestion to use the electronic sign to let people know that the law will be enforced if you use fireworks. She said it would be a good reminder that it is against the law. Councilman Mikuletzky said if anyone has a problem with fireworks they should call the police immediately. Councilwoman Reynolds said that we had three bird nesting areas on the beach and that fireworks would have a serious impact on the endangered birds. Mary Ellen Foley said that she has been riding her bike and has noticed that people have not been obeying the traffic laws. She asked if we were going to put up signs or anything to remind people of the laws. Councilm an Mikuletzky said that bikes can only ride single file. Connie Higgins of East 11 Street asked if council would give some thought to having a community garden at the Coast Guard property. Mayor Larson said no. He also said that we would have an Open Space meeting as soon as we get some plans for a stage. He said he just threw six bags of wildflowers on the northwest corner. Dick Manookian from 10 Street wanted to know who is responsible for keeping the weeds cut on the corner of 10 th and Bayview because the site line is blocked when trying to make a turn there. Someone said that it is owned by Lucille DiPasquale and someone else said it was owned by the Borough. Mayor Larson said that we would take carof it. Robin Pearson from West 11 Street said that there was a letter to the editor in the Sandpaper about the fish guts problem on the jetty. Mayor Larson said that it has been cleaned up.
