

**REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL
FEBRUARY 12, 2020**

THE CAUCUS MEETING of the Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Larson at 4:30pm at the Borough Hall, on East 7th Street. He stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the NJ Open Public Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board in Borough Hall on January 7, 2020 and was published in the Asbury Park Press and the Beach Haven Times on January 16, 2020, both newspapers are designated by Mayor and Council to receive such notice.

ROLL CALL: Spark, Wellington, *absent*, Alloway, *absent*, Reynolds, Foley, and Mikuletzky

Also present: Mayor Larson, Terry Brady, Stuart McGowan, Sponge Washburn and Brenda Kuhn

Discussion: Mayor Larson said that our Zoning Officer, Sponge Washburn, put together some regulations to amend and supplement Chapter 180-6 of Borough Code, Swimming Pools. The changes and additions that were discussed included: limiting the dewatering between June 15 and September 15, requiring the water to be directed to the nearest storm drain, the use of silt bags to keep dirt, silt, sand or runoff debris from accumulating on the streets, water pumping must be completed within 15 days, and no unreasonable noise at the site. The Mayor and Council then discussed an overnight parking issue. They talked about the current parking restrictions and the things that they wanted added to Borough code to restrict overnight parking of commercial vehicles residential areas and that an ordinance would be introduced by title at tonight's meeting. Then Mayor Larson said that the Borough was purchasing a 25'x20' steel garage for storage for the lifeguards. He said that the cost would be \$33,500 which included the slab, floors, 10' garage door and regular door and it would be placed behind the lifeguard house.

Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close the Caucus. On a motion by Foley, seconded by Reynolds and carried by all the Caucus Meeting was closed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE: Councilman Spark said he wanted to make the bill list a part of the meeting minutes. He added that the big ticket item was the Regional School tax at \$146,066.

BEACHES AND PARKS: Councilwoman Reynolds said revenue for beach badges and paw passes were up from last year. She talked about changing the hours of operation for the beach badge booth. She thought it should close at 3:00pm instead of 4:00pm, all were in favor. She said that there would be an Easter parade and dog walk at the pavilion on April 11th. Councilwoman Reynolds said that there would be more mobi mats to help people to get to the beach and she mentioned the storage building for the lifeguards.

WATER/SEWER: Councilwoman Foley said she wanted the water sewer report to be a part of the meeting minutes. She said that 2 water leaks were fixed and 6 new fire hydrants were installed. She reported that the work on East 23rd Street included installation of a storm drain and an 8-inch water main. She said that it just passed the bacteria test. She added that installation of 1" services from the oceanfront to Central Ave have begun. She said that after the street settles, paving would be done from curb to curb. Councilwoman Foley said that the Annual Drinking Water Report is completed and will be available at the end of the month. She said that our contract for the water meters has been awarded and meters should be available to the owner in May.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Councilman Mikuletzky said he would like to make the court report a part of the meeting minutes. He said it was a slow month with the court bringing in a total of \$416.30 and the Borough kept \$113.50. He said that he wanted to make the public aware that there had been sighting of coyotes or wolves in the Borough. Councilwoman Foley said that someone on 27th Street captured 4 sightings on video.

DOCKS AND HARBORS: Councilman Alloway was not present and no report was given.

PUBLIC WORKS: Councilman Wellington was not present and no report was given.

There was a discussion regarding wind farms and that they could be running cables through our town. He said that a lot of electricity would be coming through and everyone should be concerned. He said the wind farms will be 950' tall and each blade would be 33 tons.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION: Mayor Larson asked for a motion to open the open public session. There was a motion by Foley, seconded by Reynolds and carried by all.

Tim Brindley talked a little about the windfarms and said that he thought that they were going to do the cable off the Coast Guard Station in Island Beach. He said that 4 or 5 people have told him that they saw coyotes in Barnegat Light but he didn't believe it until he almost hit a one while driving one night. He said coyotes eat fox and probably cats too. He said there was an article in the SandPaper about coyotes and hybrid coywolves. Tim said that the wind farm cable coming here is very serious stuff and asked how the electric current will affect the fish.

Dick Feehan talked about the wind farm cables.

Tim Brindley said that they leased property to a foreign entity for \$26.00 per acre and he thought that they should have leased it to the fishermen.

Councilwoman Reynolds ask where the windmills would be located and Mayor Larson said from Barnegat Light to Atlantic City and would be between 5 and 15 miles off shore. He said another group goes from Atlantic City to Avalon.

Tim Brindley said that that these wind farm companies designated the shipping lanes but nothing for the fishermen. He said that the fishermen are being pushed out.

CLOSE PUBLIC SESSION: Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close the open public session. There was a motion by Mikuletzky, seconded by Foley and carried by all.

CDBG PUBLIC HEARING: At 5:31 pm Mayor Larson said we were going to have a Community Development Block Grant Public Hearing. He asked for a motion to open the hearing to the public. There was a motion by Spark, seconded by Reynolds and carried by all.

Mayor Larson said that we were applying for the block grant and requesting \$45,000. He said that the council and committees have discussed the need for more beach accessibly and have talked about the purchase of Mobi Mats. He asked the audience if they had any ideas. Tim Brindley, 1404 Bayview Avenue, mentioned the area south of the boat ramp where the sand eroded and exposed rocks which made it hard for the jet skis. Councilwoman Reynolds mentioned a handicapped floating device that could be used at the bay beach. Connie Higgins, 10 East 11th Street, suggested motorized vehicle to get handicapped people to the beach. Dick Feehan, 12 East 15th Street, recommended snow fencing along the walkways to the beach.

CLOSE CDBG PUBLIC HEARING: Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close the Community Development Block open public hearing. There was a motion by Spark, seconded by Foley and carried by all.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Barnegat Light duly advertised for the receipt of bids for the Water Meter Project (delivery of Sensus meters & advanced metering system); and

WHEREAS, at the time, place and date set for the receipt of bids, formal bids were received by the Borough as follows:

WHEREAS, said bid was taken under advisement and have been reviewed by the Borough Engineer and it has been determined that Core & Main LP submitted the lowest responsible bid in accordance with the bid specifications, said bid being in the amount of \$434,538.00; and

RESOLUTION 2020-056

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BARNEGAT LIGHT, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ADOPTING A REVISION TO THE UPDATED EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK/PERSONNEL POLICY.

WHEREAS, as part of the requirements to be eligible for Insurance Coverage as a member of the Ocean County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund and the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund, it is necessary for the Borough of Barnegat Light to review and/or update its Personnel Policy annually; and WHEREAS, various changes to the EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK/PERSONNEL POLICY are needed as a result of collective bargaining negotiations and other employee practice changes; and WHEREAS, the Borough Employee Handbook/Personnel Policy is hereby being revised to relative to Sick Leave, to read as follows:

Sick Leave

1. All employees shall be granted 10 sick days leave with pay for use during periods of their own illness or injury (prorated in first year and last year of service).
2. Sick leave may be taken in full or half days.
3. Part-time, temporary or seasonal employees are not eligible for sick leave benefits.
4. Sick leave can be accumulated to a maximum of 60 days. Sick days shall be taken from the current year's allotment of sick days first, and the use of accumulated sick days shall be taken first from the most recent year (working in reverse chronological order).
5. Sick leave with pay is hereby defined to mean a necessary absence from duty due to illness, injury or exposure to contagious disease.
6. An employee who does not expect to report for work on any working day because of an illness or other legitimate reason must notify the Borough Clerk by telephone or otherwise within 2 hours after the beginning hour of his or her tour of duty. Absence without notice for 5 consecutive days shall constitute job abandonment.
7. The Borough reserves the right to require an employee to provide a physician's certification for any absence or illness. Any employee who has used 3 or more consecutive sick days must furnish a physician's certificate at the employee's expense which conforms to the Borough's requirements.
8. An otherwise eligible employee may be deemed ineligible for payment of accrued but unused sick leave under the following circumstances:
 - (a.) An employee who, in the Borough's discretion, exhibits a pattern of abusing sick days or, upon request of the Borough, fails to submit a certification from their health care provider which conforms to the Borough's requirements. Examples of patterns of sick leave abuse are:
 - i. Calling out sick the day before or after a holiday
 - ii. Calling out sick the day before or after a scheduled vacation
 - iii. Calling out sick the day before or after a scheduled personal day
 - iv. Calling out sick the day before or after a weekend
 - (b.) The examples provided above are intended solely for illustrative purposes and do not constitute an exhaustive list.
 - (c.) The employee is not at home ill or home caring for an immediate family member who is ill, at an appointment with a health care provider, or for a limited period, collecting necessities connected with health care and recuperation (e.g., prescriptions from pharmacy), the day the employee calls out sick.
 - (d.) In addition to a nonpayment of accrued sick leave, abuse of sick leave time may result in discipline up to and including discharge from employment
9. Sick leave shall be exhausted prior to temporary disability benefits, including paid family leave. All leave time, whether paid or unpaid, that is used or allowed in connection with an event that is also covered under federal and/or state leave laws shall run contemporaneously (at the same time) with leave under federal and/or state leave laws, if applicable
10. Sick leave shall not accrue during a leave of absence without pay or suspension. Sick leave shall not accrue after an employee has resigned or retired although his or her name is being retained on the payroll until exhaustion of vacation or other compensatory leave.
11. Any employee on sick leave who, in addition, qualified under Worker's Compensation for weekly benefits shall, during the first 3-month period he or she is receiving Worker's Compensation payments, be entitled only to that portion of his or her regular salary which, when added to the Worker's Compensation payments, equals his or her normal salary. After the first 3-month period, the employee shall only receive the Worker's Compensation payments.
12. All full-time permanent employees must have at least 10 full years of service to be entitled to any retirement/separation pay for unused sick leave (up to a maximum of 60 days, capped at \$15,000.

- (a.) The employee's absences prior to their official retirement date or after notice of their intent to retire increases by 30% for the 12-month period immediately preceding either of those dates as compared to sick that employee's annual sick leave used during any one of the previous 3 calendar years; OR,
- (b.) The employee attempts to maximize sick leave payout by using sick days prior to retirement including but not limited to as a means of "terminal leave." The Borough does not provide a terminal leave program, whether formal or informal, and the conduct described may result in discipline, removal, fines and/or criminal penalties;
- (c.) The employment relationship ends for any reason other than voluntary retirement or the employee does not meet the eligibility requirements.

RESOLUTION 2020-057

Councilwoman Foley and Stuart McGowan explained the ordinance. they talked about the new requirement for new construction to have pits and curb boxes and the elimination of water meter "turn on".

ORDINANCE 2020-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BARNEGAT LIGHT, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 153 OF THE BOROUGH CODE TO REVISE THE BOROUGH'S SEWER & WATER SERVICE REGULATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Barnegat Light, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 153-14 of Article I of Chapter 153 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Barnegat Light, entitled "Repairs," is hereby amended and supplemented to provide as follows:

**Chapter 153
SEWERS AND WATER
Article I
Operation and Supervision of Systems**

§ 153-14. Repairs.

A. All service pipes connected to the water curb box and sewer system shall at all times be kept in good order and repair by the owner of the property at his own expense, and on failure to do so within 10 days the water and sewer may be cut off and kept cut off until such pipes shall be put in good order by the Borough (at the owner's expense); and the repair and the expense of cutting off and turning on the same shall be paid by the owner to the Borough. The Borough shall maintain and repair the water and sewer supply to the street as well as the water curb box and the lateral from the main line to the curb.

B. No person, property owner, contractor or other party shall damage or cause to be damaged the water or sewer supply lines of the Borough from the curb to the water or sewer main in the street.

SECTION 2. Section 153-15 of Article I of Chapter 153 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Barnegat Light, entitled "Meters," is hereby amended and supplemented to provide a revised subsection B to read as follows:

§ 153-15. Meters.

B. No person except duly authorized agents of the municipality working under the supervision of and under the direction of the Superintendent of the Water Division or any other duly authorized agent of the municipality shall set or remove meters or attempt any repairs on the same; provided, however, that licensed plumbers may set or remove meters upon obtaining written permission from the Superintendent of the Water Division to do so. Should any meter be broken or damaged by frost or otherwise by the neglect or carelessness of the persons having the use of said meter, the same shall be repaired or replaced, as the case may require, by the Borough at the expense of the owner of the premises; access to the area to be repaired or replaced must be provided by the property owner within 10 days of the event making the repair/replacement necessary.

For all new residential construction, changes of ownership, replacements of water service and/or major renovations/substantial improvements (exceeds 50% of value of building) of existing residences, the owner/seller shall be required to supply and install a meter pit and curb box in accordance with the rules, regulations and specifications of the Borough Water Department.

SECTION 3. Section 153-18 of Article I of Chapter 153 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Barnegat Light, entitled "Discontinuance of service; reinstatement," is hereby amended and supplemented to provide as follows:

§ 153-18. Discontinuance of service; reinstatement.

Persons desiring to discontinue the use of water services shall give notice, in writing, to the Water and Sewer Office with a request that the service be shut off and discontinued, and upon such application being made, a special meter reading shall be made within three working days of such request, and the amount due shall then be calculated to the date of such reading, and, upon payment of the amount due, plus the sum of \$75 for the special reading and the expense of shutting off the meter, the service will be shut off. In the event that the shutoff is required outside of the Borough's normal business hours, the charge will be \$200. All fees shall be paid to the Water and Sewer Office. In addition, special water meter readings will be made upon written request to the Water and Sewer Office, where service is not desired to be discontinued, upon payment to the Water and Sewer Office of a fee of \$25 for each special meter reading.

SECTION 4. Section 153-24 of Article I of Chapter 153 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Barnegat Light, entitled "Liability of Borough," is hereby amended and supplemented to provide as follows:

§ 153-24. Liability of Borough.

The municipality shall not be liable for any damage caused by increased pressures being put on the mains during the time of fires, drills by the fire company or any other time, and no person shall be entitled to damages or rebate of any portion of payments due for any stoppage of supply occasioned by accident, addition or repair to any part of the water or sewer system.

SECTION 5. All ordinances of parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after second reading and publication as required by law.
