REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL JANUARY 8, 2020

THE CAUCUS MEETING of the Mayor and Council was called to order by Mayor Larson at 4:30pm at the Borough Hall, on East 7th Street. He stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the NJ Open Public Meetings Act. Notice of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board in Borough Hall and was published in the Asbury Park Press and the Beach Haven Times, both newspapers are designated by Mayor and Council to receive such notice.

ROLL CALL: Spark, Wellington, Alloway, Reynolds, Foley, and Mikuletzky

Also present: Mayor Larson, Terry Brady, Stuart McGowan, Sponge Washburn and Brenda Kuhn

Discussion: Mayor Larson said that we wanted to update the Salary Ordinance to add titles and step rates and to update the sick days to make it 10 across the board. Mayor Larson started a discussion regarding pool construction, particularly the pumping of water into the streets in the summer months. Sponge Washburn said that the contractors are running the water down the streets and not into the drains and there have been many complaints. He said that Beach Haven has an ordinance that restricts "de-watering" from June 15 through September 15th. We call it ground water. Mayor Larson said maybe we could do July 1st through Labor Day. There was talk about issuing violations, fees that can be charged by the court, and also shutting down the projects until the contractor goes to court. Sponge said that he needs the contractors contact information for after hours and weekends. He also said that he started having the pool contractor sign and initial a form that states the water must be pumped to the drain. Another problem that he brought up was that it's not just the water, it's the crew, trucks, dumping of sand and pavers into the streets which block parking. Mayor Larson said he talked to Stuart about the water problem and Stu suggested requiring the contractors to use silt bags so that the sand doesn't go into the storm drain and clog the system. Sponge added that Beach Haven requires silt bag filters and maybe we should add it to our swimming pool ordinance. He said that in 2019, 16 pools were put in and approximately 4 are going in now. Sponge said that everyone that puts in a pool also puts in a gas fire pits/fireplace and we don't have any ordinance on these. He said that he thinks that there should be code requiring the gas fire pits to be 5' from the property line and 10' from any structure for safety. Councilwoman Reynolds said that Cricket Luker had ideas for the park which included: An Easter parade/dog walk, artist creating things to put your face in, local artists creating garden sculptures made from recycled materials, community gardens, painting the concrete wall with vines and flowers and talking tours/slide shows. She added that Nancy Gallimore has been all over the world and has some outstanding photographs. She said that Nancy has done presentations for the Ladies Auxiliary.

Mayor Larson asked for a motion to close the Caucus. On a motion by Foley, seconded by Spark and carried by all the Caucus Meeting was closed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE: Councilman Spark said that the big ticket items on the bill list were the \$158,000 for the Regional School tax, \$1,013,000 for the County tax and payment to LBTPD was \$162,000, up by 2% per contract.

PUBLIC WORKS: Councilman Wellington reported on the DPW as follows:

- All the Christmas decoration were taken down and put away
- Beach debris collected-trying to stay ahead
- Cutting of the dune fencing at the beach entrances
- Filled potholes
- Skateboard park ramps finished
- Everything left at the non-motorized watercraft area have been removed
- Replace faded signs on Central Ave.

DOCKS AND HARBORS: Councilman Alloway said that the municipal docks were closed therefore he had nothing to report.

BEACHES AND PARKS: Councilwoman Reynolds reported that the revenue for the Paw Passes were down by \$900.00. She said that dog licenses were due this month and that holiday beach badges were still available.

WATER/SEWER: Councilwoman Foley reported the following:

- Authorizing water meters
- Fixed 3 meter pits that were leaking
- Started replacing hydrants, 2 so far and hydrants were painted
- Cleaned up all the Borough catch basins

PUBLIC SAFETY: Councilman Mikuletzky said that he wanted to make the court report a part of the minutes. He reported that the court brought in \$1,192.96 in December. He said the Fish & Game will get \$270.00 of it and the Borough kept \$281.00.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION: Mayor Larson asked for a motion to open the open public session. There was a motion by Wellington, seconded by Alloway and carried by all.

CJ Rhodes of Yellow House, PA said she was at the meeting to explain to Mayor and Council about a 3-day Symposium for Integrative Health that she was requesting to have at the Pavilion in June. She explained that they held it in Harvey Cedars for the past 3 years in September and they wanted to move the event to Barnegat Light. Some of the things that were talked about were:
